

Indigo Dyed Shibori

Workshop 0422

Alison is particularly drawn to surface design. She finds appealing the idea of beginning with a piece of white fabric and influencing each stage of the design. Her interest in plants and the environment

comes through in many of her textile pieces, as does her interest in ancient techniques, such as shibori and cyanotype. Alison uses many processes in her art practice including indigo and fibre-reactive dyeing, shibori, cyanotype, wax resist, breakdown printing, screen printing, stencilling and hand stitching. While continually seeking to improve her own skills, Alison is very keen to share her knowledge with others. She has taken part in many local and international exhibitions and been awarded prizes for her work.

Indigo dyed shibori

In this workshop, students will learn the history of shibori and the preparation of a pre-reduced indigo vat. They will be introduced to different techniques of folded, clamped, bound and stitched shibori. Alison will demonstrate these techniques and assist students to achieve these shibori patterns. Students will then be able to indigo dye as many pieces as time allows.

Alison's aim is to facilitate a class where students create a number of beautiful examples of indigo dyed shibori to take home.

Workshop Description

Over three days, immerse yourself in design, techniques, and materials to create a piece of textile art unique to you. Neroli will take you through the basics of design, encourage you to think outside your comfort zone, and encourage you to go your own way. You will get the opportunity to explore fabric paint, fused collage, and surface design elements. This class enables everyone to work in their own ways, and you can choose to do it as pure collage and surface design with no sewing, with hand stitch, or with machine stitching. You do not need to be able to draw. This is a small class to facilitate lots of one-on-one time.
